Defining nursing. Historically nursing was regarded as a vocation and to some extent was seen as a duty. Past definitions of nursing knowledge have included those of Conrad (1947), who described nursing knowledge as 'knowing what the patient wants before she (the nurse) is asked', and Katz (1969) who described it as 'knowledge of the heart'.

Once the general hospital orientation is done—the same one new nurses and every other new employee usually goes through—you meet the Nursing Professional Development Specialist (NPDS; also known as nurse educator). This is the person who will guide you into all things clinical, with knowledge, skill, and encouragement.

What does a Nursing Professional Development Specialist ...

A broad base of nursing knowledge including physiology, pharmacology and nursing theories is needed for effective critical thinking, clinical judgement and decision-making. Nurses develop expertise in nursing through the acquisition of nursing knowledge and clinical experience (Crisp & Taylor, 2005).

The central role of clinical reasoning and decision-making in our application of nursing and other knowledge is a complex and vital component of our practice. Powered by intellectual engagement and together with watching-assessment-recognition it directs how we implement the other concepts of the Careful Nursing critical circle of clinical responsibility.

Clinical Reasoning and Decision-making - Careful Nursing

In the clinical care domain of nursing, excellent nursing practice is the dynamic process that integrates the best theoretical and practice knowledge (praxis) in each client * encounter. It involves the ability to promote health and well-being through the health illness continuum within all: the individual; the family; and the community.

Nursing ethics is also another aspect of knowledge that explores the moral phenomena and the nature of good nursing practices (Crowe & O'Malley, 2006). Theorists have examined development of nursing knowledge from diverse philosophical dimensions. Kim (1999) explored reflective inquiry as a way of developing knowledge in nursing practice.
